THE ADULT GUIDE

A Little Moment for Two

Only one challenge at a time. The child can observe, point, or name.

Preparing the Cards

Print on A4, 100%, single-sided. Pages 3-4: animals; pages 7-8: foods. Adult cuts along the dotted lines. For the size games on pages 5-6, cut out the two cards below; keep the top model.

Start with Two Images

Choose two familiar animals. Say: "This is the rabbit." Let your child look and touch. Then suggest: "Can you show me the rabbit?" If they hesitate, name it again without expecting success.

Finding a Pair

Place two model cards face up. Give one identical image at a time and show a match. Then let your child try. Add a third pair only if the game remains easy and enjoyable.

Ages 2-3

A few minutes may be enough. The printed words are for the adult. No memorisation of writing or word cards to match. The picture helps to talk; it does not replace the real object.

Always with an Adult

Keep cards away from the mouth. Remove any damaged cards and cuttings. If you laminate, round the corners. Store scissors and small pieces after preparation.

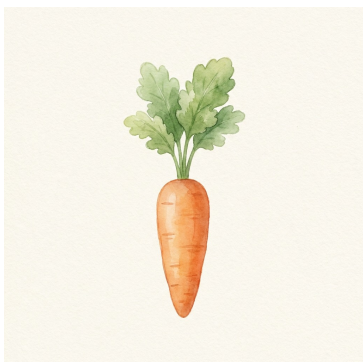

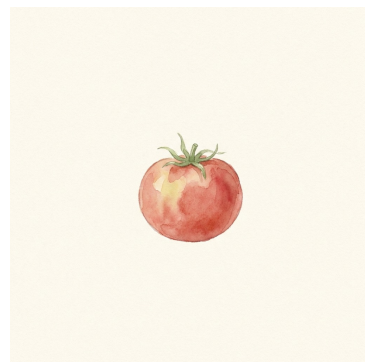

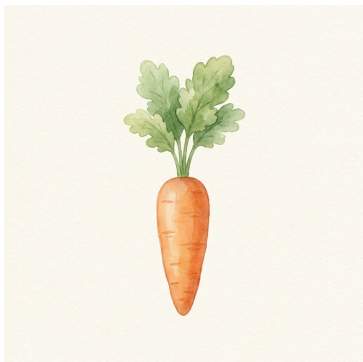

TO BE READ BY THE ADULT

Three Ways to Play

Keep it simple. No need to do all three on the same day.

01 • The Little Picture Book

Place two cards. Name the animal and make a small comment:
“The rabbit has long ears.” Welcome a word, gesture, or look.



02 • The Picture and the Object

Place an apple and a pear out of reach of the mouth. Present the matching cards. Show: “The apple is here, its picture is there.”
Then invite your child to point.



03 • Searching for the Pair

Spread out two models face up. Give one identical card at a time.
Your child places it on the model. They compare the pictures directly; this is not a memory game.



When interest fades, tidy up together. The same activity can return another day.

AFTER THE CARDS

Discoveries Continue

The joy of recognising a picture continues in everyday life.

At the Market

Find a food item from the cards. Say its name, shape, and colour. The child can simply point.

**In a Book**

Look together for a rabbit, a tortoise, or a butterfly. The drawings may differ: it's the same animal.

In Nature

Observe an animal from a distance. Look without touching and leave the little creatures in their environment.

For Later, If Interested
